I am so proud of our seniors. Many have followed through on completing their SAT's or college placement tests, applying for college and along with their parents, completed the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). College acceptance letters should be arriving in the mail soon. It is so exciting. These seniors have supportive parents. Continue with your good work. Here are a few more upcoming deadlines to be aware of:

- If your student has not finished applying for college, they can still turn in most applications, if they complete them by Feb. $15^{\text {th }}$.
- Feb. $15^{\text {th }}$ is a common day for scholarship applications to be due. Look at the application closely since some have to be post-dated by that date and others have to arrive by that date.
- Make a copy of all your student's scholarship applications. Since many ask the same questions, they can save time by cutting and pasting information.
- Submit the FAFSA if you have not yet. Men 18 or older must register for the selective service to receive federal financial aid so do take care of that also.
- Ask Missy to send 1st semester transcripts to your student's selected colleges after February $10^{\text {th }}$.
- Watch for signs of "senioritis". Colleges are looking for students with consistent high grades up to the very last day of high school. Final admissions are based on the last transcript.
- Start talking about housing options and apply for on campus housing if that is your choice.

And of course, give me a call if you have any questions or need assistance. Keep up the good work! Mrs. McCartney.

## Site Council News for December

Site Council met in the Science Lab on Tuesday, January 17th. Members present were Sheila McCartney, Teri Ryder, Anna Scharf, Nancy Johnston, Dean Deters, Robin Stoutt, Jennifer Moran, Tammy Ruegsegger and Janet Person.

Mrs. McCartney shared with us that the juniors will be joining some other schools at a Career Fair which is being held at a church in McMinnville. They will listen to speakers, have mock interviews and prepare resumes for this event. Mrs. Richards will be helping the students to get ready for the fair.

Mrs. McCartney also reported that the results were in for the Readistep test that the Freshmen took. This is a test that is piloted by the College Board and is aligned with the Common Core Standards. It helps them to see their strengths and the teachers can look at trend data and use that for planning. The school will also be able to follow the students' growth and make sure they're on target. Subjects that are included on the test are critical reading, writing and math. The reports show that our students did very well.

Mrs. Stoutt reported on the Family Math Night that will be taking place on February 2nd. This will be for grades K - 5 and will start at $3: 45$ in the old gym. At this time the families will be informed of vocabulary and strategies that are being used with Singapore math and how it relates to the Common Core Standards. After that, families can break into grade levels and see how things are being done in their particular student's class. Each session will be held twice to enable parents with more than one student to attend all of their children's sessions.

The Perrydale Science Fair will be held on March 20th and will be run similarly to last year's. Grades K - 2 will be doing group projects, but do have the option of doing an individual project if they want to. High School students will be judging the projects.

School-Wide Improvement Day will be held on Wednesday, April 25 th this year. Superintendent of Schools, Susan Castillo, has accepted our invitation to be there so this should be a very special year for this event. Once again we will be working with Mrs. Romey's leadership kids. Site Council will do more planning next month and are working on thinking of a theme. If anyone has any ideas, you can let Mrs. Stoutt, Mrs. McCartney or Mrs. Person know.

Site Council is held on the second Tuesday of each month in the Science Lab. If anyone would like to be a part of Site Council, please contact Mrs. McCartney, Mrs. Stoutt or Mrs. Person at the school.


## Vaccine Update

Immunization reporting season is here! Oregon law states that all children attending school in Oregon must show proof of current immunization status.
Schools are required every year to file reports with the county health department about each child's immunization status. Children who are not fully immunized are to be excluded from attending school until their immunizations are brought up to date. The reporting process takes place January $11^{\text {th }}$ this year and the exclusion date is February $15^{\text {th }}$. If you receive a letter from the county health department, your child may be missing some required immunizations. Exceptions are granted only for medical or religious reasons.

When your child receives immunizations, it is your responsibility to provide the information to the school. You may come in to the school and update your child's Certificate of Immunization form. If your child had chicken pox disease, the Varicella vaccine is not required, but you must provide in writing a date stating when the disease occurred.

Immunizations are available from your Health Care Provider or from the Polk County Health Department immunizations clinic located at 182 SW Academy, Dallas, Oregon.

## Assessment Information

During the spring of 2012, from January through May, all students will be engaged in Oregan's Assessment of Knowledge and Skills(OAKS). The content areas include: reading/literature, mathematics, science and social science as well as writing. The writing test will be provided only to $11^{\text {th }}$ graders, with only one opportunity to take it this year.

The $11^{\text {th }}$ grade writing test will again ask for a one to two page paper that will be sent to Oregon Department of Education where two readers will be identified and will provide a score for the student.


All tests will be provided online. Reading/literature and mathematics are the two content areas that will be provided to all grade levels, third through eleventh grade. Science and Social Science will be available to $5^{\text {th }}, 8^{\text {th }}$, and high school students. Up to three opportunities can be provided for reading/literature, math and science; up to two opportunities for social science; and one opportunity for writing ( $11^{\text {th }}$ grade only).

Perrydale has been successful in making the $100 \%$ participation rate. This is important for students as they grow in their skills and for the district's adequate yearly progress.

We ask for families to make sure that their student is rested and provided nutritious food before taking the state test. It makes quite a difference in their test results. Your students will be sharing with you when these days will occur. We are confident that our students will once again do well on meeting the standards that this assessment reflects.
